Ministers and negotiators leave Hawaii committed to build on the momentum of this meeting by staying in close contact at negotiators continue their intensive engagement to find common ground. Negotiators will also continue to work to formaliz the achievements that have been made this week.

In this last stage of negotiations, we are more confident than ever that TPP is within reach and will support jobs and econogrowth.
