

The Inter sessional Round of Negotiations in the signing of a Free Trade Agreement between the Republic of Panama and the United Mexican States concludes.



The Governments of Mexico and the Republic of Panama ended the Inter sessional Round of negotiations for the conclusion of a Free Trade Agreement (FTA), held in Panama City from 13 to 17 January 2014.

The subjects who met during this round were: National Treatment and Market Access for Goods, Rules and Procedures of Origin, Services and Investment, and Government Procurement.

Mexico and Panama are firmly committed to this negotiation process as it will provide the basis for ensuring the free movement of goods and services in Latin America and the Caribbean.

As a result of the Free Trade Agreement, both countries will increase their competitiveness and consolidate its presence as a privileged platform for production and distribution of goods and services, both in America as in global markets.

This meeting is part of the commitment made by our Presidents Enrique Peña Nieto and Ricardo Martinelli, about the intention to promote progress in the dialogue and constructive engagement to achieve prompt and beneficial conclusion of the negotiation. With a great atmosphere, great progress was made in meetings, agreeing to perform in Mexico City, the Fourth Round of Negotiations, from 4 to 7 February 2014.
